Which data are processed and for what use and regarding which legal basis?

We process your name and your e-mail address to be able to inform you about product news, events and technical news. Legal basis for this is our legitimate interest (Art 6 Abs 1 lit f GDPR) to approach to our customers.

Who receives your data?

We use the online service "Newsletter2go", Köpenicker Str. 126, 10179 Berlin for the dispatch of our mailings. Personal related data, that we process in relation with the preparation and execution of our mailings, will be disclosed to Newsletter2go, who is acting as data processor. Newsletter2go is EU-GDPR compliant and TÜV certified. The transmission of your data to Newsletter2go is therefore permitted according to Art. 45 of the GDPR.

Your rights

You have the right of information about the processing of personal related data as per Art 15 GDPR and the right of correction according to Art 16 GDPR. You can ask for cancellation of your data, if there is a reason for cancellation according Art 17 (1) (a) until (f) GDPR. Moreover you have the right to ask for limitation of the data processing, if there are the relevant conditions according to Art. 18 GDPR for it. Or you can enter an objection against the data processing according to Art 21 GDPR . Furthermore you have the right according to Art. 20 GDPR to ask to get the data that you have given us and that we process, on a data carrier in a usual data format or have these data been sent to a third person (right to receive personal data in a machine-readable format).

If you think that we violate the data protection law by processing your personal data, you have the possibility to make a complaint at the authority in charge (in Austria it is the data protection authority)
